**Father's Day**

One ministry I participate in is visiting teenagers who are in trouble and have been incarcerated. They are locked up for a variety of reasons – drugs, alcohol, burglary, assault, or running away. Some are there to protect them from abusive adults. I have been doing these visits for 10 months now and have visited about 65 different kids. The one very common trait that is impossible to miss is that these kids come from very unstable homes. Some are living with one parent or the other while many live with relatives or are in foster care. Of all the kids I have visited, only two were living with both of their parents.

This has caused me to look at my own life and upbringing with much gratitude and thanksgiving. I had the good fortune of being raised by two devoted parents who loved and cared for my siblings and me. I wasn't always the best son, but my parents were always faithful to their goal of raising me as a good Christian and a good citizen.

My Mom and Dad were both great parents but since this is Father's Day I would like to tell you a few things about my Dad. First, he understood from the beginning that being a father was going to mean sacrifice. When he married my mom she was still raising her younger brother and sister which meant he was going to have to be a dad on the first day of their marriage. He provided for them in the very best way he could on the small salary he received working in a warehouse. Many times that meant that he (and my Mom) went without the things he really wanted and needed.

My dad was always a big sportsman. He loved to golf, fish and hunt but he gave those things up for several years while my brothers, sister and I were young. Instead of going and doing those things he spent hours playing baseball and football with us in the backyard and out in the street. He was the most popular dad in the neighborhood because he took time to work with all the kids in the area as a quasi-coach. He taught us to be good Catholics by sending us to Cathedral School and by praying the Rosary with us in the evening. He wasn't perfect, but I thank God for him everyday.

On this Father's Day, take a few moments to thank God for your dad or for that person who fulfilled that role in your life. Try and forgive them for any of their shortcomings and ask God to bless them on this special day.

**MISSION TRIP RETURNS!**

During the early morning hours on Saturday, May 29th fifty-four St. Michael/St Mary parishioners, young and not so young, departed from St. Michael Parish and headed for the first stop on our journey, Oklahoma City, OK. During our short time there we visited the Oklahoma City National Memorial. The Memorial staff had arranged for us to hear from a surviving family member whose story of faith and hope will stay with us forever. The memorial is done in a remarkable fashion to memorialize the people who lost their lives in this tragic event, but it also does a spectacular job of demonstrating the goodness of the people who responded and the hope that came from them. The Memorial is a must for your "bucket lists".

After traveling for about eight hours on Sunday, we realized we would not make the evening mass time in Lake Charles. This being our fifth year, I knew that it was all in God's plan and we just needed to see what he had in store for us. So the search began for an alternate plan to attend Mass. Our alternate plan took us to St. Anne's in Beaumont, TX, where Monsignor William Manger graciously invited us to join a celebration for their graduates and for pizza in their newly built youth house (Hurricane Rita had destroyed the other one). It was a great time for us to eat, visit and relax but with one more hour of travel in front of us we said goodbye to our newly found friends in Christ.

Upon our arrival in Lake Charles we unpacked, got settled in and prepared ourselves for the work we would begin on Monday morning. The days in Louisiana were spent traveling right down near the Gulf of Mexico in Cameron Parish a place hit hard by Hurricanes Rita and Ike. Our work included painting and staining of various decks in the area, putting in linoleum flooring, cabinets, and sheetrock in a home, and the cleaning of a couple of lots that had not yet been done. During this time we were able to visit with our old friends, such as Ms. Julie and Ms. Jean and were able to make new ones such as Ms. Mary, Ms. Mildred, Mr. Steven, Mr. Perry and our little pal Paul.

One of the highlights of our trip this year was being able to celebrate a Votive Mass to Avert Storms with the Bishop of Lake Charles, Most Rev. Glen John Provost, on Tuesday, June 1st, (the beginning of Hurricane Season) at Our Lady Star of the Sea in Cameron. Being able to worship with the locals and to unite in prayer with them was a humbling experience, not only because of the way we were dressed (keep in mind the above mentioned jobs) but because the people and the Bishop were so thankful for our presence. On Thursday evening we enjoyed another highlight of our trip, a Louisiana seafood boil. Our host was Mr. John Canik, a local business man. Many of our participants enjoyed their first taste of jambalaya, crawfish and fresh shrimp

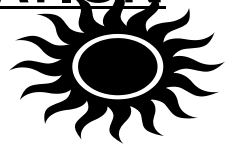

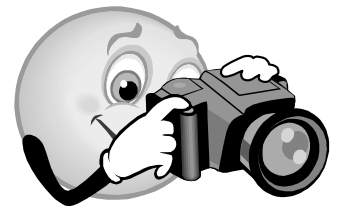
### Parish Tithe – 2009-10
