FR. DANIEL'S CORNER:

Greetings from Fr. Daniel, Praise be Jesus Christ! I was asked by Fr. Cimprich to briefly introduce myself and give a 'brief' history of my journey which led me to the Parish of St. Michael's. I was born in St. Paul, Minnesota, and was raised in the suburb of Oakdale, MN. I have one older sister and one younger brother.

Education: I graduated from Tartan High School in 1974 and then went on to attend the University of Minnesota for the next two years. I then transferred to the College of St. Thomas, graduating in 1978 with a double major in Sociology and Criminal Justice. I attended the St. Paul Seminary in 1980 for a brief period of time. I discerned that it just wasn't for me at that time in my life and returned to my former night manager position at a local restaurant.

Marriage: It was there that I met my future wife and we were married two years later in 1982. We moved to Woodbury, MN. Where we lived as a family for the next 16 years. During that period of time we were blessed with two children, a girl and a boy. I was truly blessed to have been a husband and father, totally involved in all aspects of raising our family. Marriage presented me with a whole new perspective of parents. I came away with a deeper respect and admiration for the many self-sacrifices they made out of love for our family.

Employment: My 1st job was as a reserve police officer for the City of Oakdale, MN. I was also to become their 1st community service officer, basically consisting of catching stray dogs in the community. My job was short lived as my mother made me resign as I was bringing home all the stray dogs. In August 1983, I was hired as a correction officer for the Stillwater Correctional Facility. After five months, I transferred to Oak Park Heights, the states maximum security prison. I was promoted to sergeant in 1994, and to lieutenant in 1997. During my tenure as a correctional officer, I learned a great deal regarding man's inhumanity to fellow man, and consequently, what happens to a human being, once stripped of all respect and dignity. I was trained to the level of: Firefighter II, Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate; and as a Haz-Mat, Level I Technician. I was also an American Heart CPR instructor for over 20 years. It was during my time with the department that the City of Woodbury grew from a population of 6,000 to over 60,000. I responded to over 1,000 ambulance calls during this period and encountered every imaginable situation you can think of occurring. It was through these experiences that I learned a great deal about tragedy, sorrow, and suffering families, as well as individuals experience through traumatic events. I also came away with a deep reverent appreciation for the gift of life; how precious life is, and how in a matter of seconds a life can be terminated or changed forever due to an unforeseen accident.

Religion: My 1st remembrance of going to church was when I was 4 years old. The church was called Guardian Angels in Lake Elmo, MN. My grandmother on my mother's side of the family, was the greatest influence regarding my Catholic faith. She will be 99 in November 2010 and still attends daily Mass. It was my grandmother who taught me how to pray the rosary. Throughout their lives my grandparents attended daily Mass. I am proud to say that my grandparents, as well as my mother, were models of a faith-filled life, centered upon the love for our Lord and savior, Jesus Christ.

Turning Point: February 27, 1994. I was working the 3rd Watch, 3-11p.m. shift, as sergeant of Complex 3. It was during this shift that I was involved in a life-threatening, physical assault by an inmate. I was out on a work-related injury for the next three weeks. I returned to work and in the spring of 1997 I was promoted to lieutenant, and was assigned as Watch Commander of the 1st Watch, 11-7 a.m. In the spring of 1998 I was involved with a grave situation that had taken place in the segregation unit of the prison. I was to make a decision that ended my career in corrections.

Divorce: It was during this same period of time that my wife filed for a divorce. Our divorce was finalized in June of 1999. I must admit, as difficult as the divorce was for me, it was much worse for our children. It took a long period of time for me to fully comprehend that our marriage was over. I guess I was "old-fashioned" in my thinking that marriage vows were forever. Over time our children "adjusted" and as teenagers became more involved with their friends, all the while distancing themselves more and more from their parents.

Annulment: In 2001 I began meeting with a priest friend I knew from the St. Paul Seminary. He became my spiritual adviser and helped me work through the divorce and loss of job. It was during this period that I began the process for an annulment. My ex-wife initially refused to cooperate and my case was denied, as I had always believed our marriage was based upon our vows and had no impediments on the day of our marriage. However, my ex-wife, upon receiving the denial for the annulment, filed an appeal. The case was tried again, this time under her initiation and the annulment was granted two years later.

Discernment and Prayer: It was mid-summer 2004 when after much spiritual guidance, prayer, and soul searching, I discerned that perhaps God was calling me once again to the priesthood. I began an on-line vocation search and wound up coming out to the Diocese of Sioux Falls. I spent a week-end at Broom Tree with then, Bishop Carlson. After the weekend, Bishop Carlson asked me to come down and spend a pastoral year living in Sioux Falls. I arrived in late November 2004, and worked with Fr. Jim Friedrich at Avera McKennan for the next 6 months. In August 2005, I began my Theological studies at Holy Apostles Seminary, in Cromwell, Connecticut. I graduated with a Masters in Divinity, May 7, 2010. I was assigned to different parishes during my summer breaks throughout the diocese. My 1st summer (2006) was in Marty, S.D. working with Fr. David Tickerhoof and the Yankton Sioux Tribe. My 2nd summer (2007) I was assigned to Tea/Parker working with Fr. David Stevens. My 3rd summer (2008) I was assigned to Artesian, Woonsocket, Wessington Springs, and the mission church of Duncan working again with Fr. Jim Friedrich. On May 28, 2009 I was ordained to the transitional diaconate in St. Joseph's Cathedral. My last summer (2009), I was assigned to Mobridge with Fr. John Short.

Priesthood: Due to the renovation of St. Joseph's Cathedral, the ordination for the priesthood was held in Aberdeen on May 28, 2010. It was a most grace filled day. I was assigned to the Parish of St. Michael beginning July 1. Since my arrival, I have been overwhelmed with the graciousness and hospitality I have received by everyone. Know that I keep all of you in my daily prayers, and would respectfully ask for you to do the same for me. Know that my door is always open. God's blessings and peace be with each and everyone of you.
