**Cimply Putting It...**

*All Stars & All That Jazz...* Growing up, I loved baseball. I loved collecting baseball cards (wish I would have saved them but that's another story) and I even loved listening to baseball on the radio. My hometown of Tabor has had amateur baseball for several years. This year they are ranked in the top 10 in their class and are leading their division. My interest in baseball has waned the past several years for a variety of reasons, but this year I have noticed among many of you a sense of renewed interest because of the new Target Field in Minneapolis and the success of the Twins and our own Sioux Falls Fighting Pheasants. With the All Star Game in the books and the first half of the Pheasants season completed (which they were the champs) now it gets down to who can endure the grueling schedule of the baseball season. Endurance and patience are two qualities of any good baseball team. Baseball is definitely a marathon and not a sprint. Here is where the baseball season can teach us something about life. Just observing, I have noticed that a lot of people today are living life and faith like sprinters. We've heard life described as a "rat race" and for many people it really is a race. But most people don't see it as a long season. They see it as a series of short sprints. They run from one thing to another. Sometimes they hit the wall and wind up with a faith that is completely out of breath. Also to be a good baseball player or any athlete for that matter, one has to be strong. One good thing about growing up in a small town was that I could make the team without being a very good athlete. We generally only had 9 guys that wanted to play! They had to pick me just to field the team. We also have to be strong in our faith. I recall a story of a young boy who was helping his dad pick rocks out of the field. Not a very pleasant job for any farm kid or for anyone for that matter. Everything went along fine until the boy came to a fairly large rock embedded firmly in the ground. The dad watched as the boy pushed, pulled and did everything in his power to move the rock. But it didn't budge. The more he tried, the more frustrated he got. The father walked over and asked his son, "Are you using all your strength?" The boy said he was and the father replied, "No, you're not." The boy stopped and looked at his father, giving him one of those, "What are you some kind of idiot?" looks that a kid can give. Then the father said, "You haven't asked me to help." In our faith lives, too, we can stay plugged into God's power through the Sacraments and our daily prayer. Since we have passed the All Star break, this is a good time to evaluate our spiritual life and get ready for the second half of the season.

*JazzFest 2010* was this weekend in Sioux Falls. Isn't summer in Sioux Falls just the greatest? We already have had Hot Harley Nights and Hot Summer Nights. Along with baseball, in my hometown of Tabor, everyone loves to dance. As soon as I was a toddler learning to "toddle" I was ready to move and groove to polka music in our local dance hall. Have you noticed that small children don't care if their moves are "cool"? Children don't care if they look silly as they dance to the sounds of music. They just dance. But I suspect that even those of you reading this, who for the most part are cha-cha challenged, still have a secret desire to reclaim the freedom enjoyed as a child spinning, twirling, and swaying with complete abandon to the rhythms of the music. Even people my age—when we're in the car alone—love to turn up the music and sway and sing. What else could explain the crazy popularity of the weekly show "Dancing with the Stars". The St. Michael Staff members love that show. Some of the "celebrity" dancers are athletes or twenty-somethings who've spent half their lives in gyms. But a large number of the contestants have been "has beens"—recycled, retreaded actors, entertainers, singers, and celebrities whose days in the lime-light have come and gone. Aging astronauts, pooped pop-stars, actors on extended hiatus, 82 year old Academy Award winners—they all show up to show off and strut their stuff one last time. Most of the dancing "stars" have already burned out, but as they attempt to groove to the music I find myself rooting for them. I suppose at least secretly we all long to dance among the "stars". Even if one knows nothing about the roots of jazz, or have never listened to a Dixie-land band, it's a safe bet that you know one old standard, "When the Saints Go Marching In". When I hear it I also hear Louie Armstrong singing it in my head. Down south, I'm told, the song is traditionally played after grave side services, when the dead are buried and the mourners leave the cemetery, the jazzy, jubilant strains of "When the Saints Go Marching In" follow the faithful out of the cemetery. But think about it. You can't march to that song. Marching is a misnomer in the title. Nobody can march to that melody. All you can do is dance to it. The saints don't go marching in; they go dancing in. I guess that's why I remember in my hometown noted for Czech food, drink and music, we gathered in Beseda Hall after a funeral for the luncheon and sometimes the polka music would be playing. One of our loved ones was now dancing with the saints while we ate and tapped our toes on the old wooden dance floor of the hall. I know I'm no All Star, but I do want to be in that number when the saints go dancing in.

What is notable about the bas reliefs of the Apostles? There are two very interesting characteristics of the bas reliefs of the Apostles, particularly with the Restoration underway. First, their posture is noteworthy: all of the Apostles are looking towards the altar. Second, with their colorization, each Apostle is painted with a different color scheme, which corresponds to each of the twelve gems which St. John's book of Revelation speaks of as lining the walls of the heavenly Jerusalem. These gems in turn correspond to each of the Twelve tribes of Israel and the colors of their robes.
