Pastoral Planning update

Since January of this year, there have been 6 meetings of the pastoral planning committee. The next one is scheduled on July 8th, 2010, 6:30pm at Holy Spirit to begin finalizing our recommendations to the Bishop. All are welcome to attend. There is time at the end with an open microphone for audience comments and questions.

Here is just a brief refresher of what the pastoral planning committee is doing and some of the changes that have happened over the past few months.

1. The pastoral planning committee is made up of 1 member from the 10 parishes in Sioux Falls, 1 member from the Brandon parish and a representative from Harrisburg. There is a tentative plan proposed for the restructuring of the east river diocese and its parishes mostly based on the decreasing number of priests that will be serving. The role of this committee is to present recommendations to the Bishop for the Sioux Falls area. The Bishop would also like recommendations on how to become more vibrant and faithful Catholic parishes.
2. Initially, our committee was given the task of trying to service all the parishes, the prisons, the hospitals, the colleges, and the nursing homes with 11 priests instead of 19. Our task has been changed. We are now to just give recommendations for 11 priests to service the parishes, possibly Harrisburg, the colleges and the nursing homes.

Here are a few of the ideas we are attempting to agree on:

1. Do we close a parish or two in Sioux Falls so that the bigger parishes can have more than one priest? Priests per parish as follows: Christ the King – 1, St Mary – 1, St Lambert – 1, St Michael -2, Risen Savior – 1, St Katharine Drexel – 1, Holy Spirit – 2, St Therese – 1, Cathedral – 2.
2. Close Our Lady of Guadalupe and combine them with the Cathedral and St. Josephine Bakhita with 2 priests.
3. Close Christ the King and Our Lady of Guadalupe also, so the Cathedral can have 3 priests with St Josephine Bakhita and Our Lady of Guadalupe.
4. Establish a Newman Center or Newman Club at Christ the King.
5. Explore transitioning some of the priest's administrative duties of a parish to lay people.
6. Investigate the feasibility of establishing a parish in Harrisburg.
7. Increase training and formation of lay people to help with ministries and administration.

The committee does realize that St. Michael Parish should have 2 priests. But to accomplish this, a parish or two may have to close in Sioux Falls. There will be other ideas presented at the next meeting and a consensus from our group will be reached. If you have any questions or comments feel free to e-mail me at pjkeeper@sio.midco.net.

Deacon's Digest

Mission Trip Musings

"On a blistering hot Monday morning, the crew (Maggie, Ali, Karli, Melissa, Tegen, and DD – that's Deacon Devlin) and I ventured west down the road in the back of Miss Julie's pick-em-up truck to Miss Mary's house. As we arrived at the home and entered the front door I noticed the unmistakable stench of raccoon. I looked up and spotted the mangy critter. Since the rest of the crew (excluding me and DD) were frightened by the striped bandit, DD grabbed a pole and began a narrow chase around the house. I followed quickly behind ready to assist. We finally ran the critter out of its temporary home, sending it a clear message to never return."

That little piece above is an excerpt from an article written by Kailey Tennesen about our experience at Miss Mary's house on our first day of work in Louisiana. For us, the raccoon was an adventure and an experience to be remembered. For Miss Mary and others in Creole it is just one more problem among the many they have to deal with as they try and rebuild their homes.

Miss Mary's house was completely taken away by Hurricane Rita. When she and her husband began rebuilding, Hurricane Ike came along and swept away everything they had started. Right after they had finished the outside shell of their house, her husband was diagnosed with cancer and died six weeks later. She was counting on her son to assist her in finishing the project but he was deployed to Afghanistan. Besides these tragedies, fighting with insurance companies, government agencies, a shortage of carpenters, plumbers and other skilled labor is an everyday reality for these folks.

Working on her home was one of several projects that our Mission Trip Crew worked on. Besides laying vinyl flooring, staining cabinets and walls, and putting up sheetrock at her house, work was done cleaning up a lot, decks were stained and painted, fences were removed and repaired, and a deck railing was lowered. The teams performed the work admirably and without complaint but that's not all they did. They also spread a lot of cheer and gave much hope to the people we served. The people of Cameron Parish, LA were very impressed with the youth of St. Michael (and St. Mary) Parish.

For me, this trip simply affirmed what I already believed - that our kids are great! You can be very proud of the wonderful ways they represented all the members of St. Michael's on this trip. The future of our society and our Church is in good hands indeed!
